#### **Director's Notes**

Reflecting on the 10th Anniversary of DCC, one might wonder how it all began. Well, the Maryland Conservatory of Music was looking to develop an adult choir and I was approached since I had a successful high school program. I thought

it would be a fun retirement project. Of course that was 2005 and I ended up retiring in 2009.

Registrations were handled through the conservatory and advertised in their brochure of course offerings. Tuition was quite pricey and did not include music. I contacted some of my former students and twisted the arms of close friends ending up with an inaugural ensemble of 12 unbalanced voices. Among those original daring souls was Mary Sue Shaw who is still singing with us. I asked her to conjure up some reflections from those early days when we rehearsed at John Carroll's auxiliary building, and here are some of her recollections:

• As I remember we were there for four semesters (we auickly outgrew the place) and then moved to North Harford High School's new facility. I remember touring the still rough planter feature in the atrium of North Harford and saying that the serpentine fixture reminded us of a water way. Thus the name Deer Creek was fitting. (Louise Ballard actually came up with the name.) We sang in that open space and delighted in our echoes. After the crowded rehearsal space we had suffered with before, North Harford seemed like a Cathedral.

Another point Mary Sue forgot to mention was the competing sound of a bagpiper practicing outside the conservatory. Thus our humble beginnings...

### **DCYC News...**



#### **Birthdays and Celebrations**


We have three birthdays to celebrate in October. Amber McCafferty begins the month with a celebration on **October** 12th. Sharon Kachur follows

### Past Service Highlights—Pennies for Peace!

One of the most ambitious service programs ever undertaken by the DCC was the 2008 Central Asian Institute Project— Pennies for Peace which raised and donated \$30,000 to build a school in Pakistan.

The idea began when Marty read the bestseller Three Cups of Tea about the plight of education-starved young women in Central Asia, and wondered if it would be possible to raise funds to build "just one school" for them. Eleven months later, with the support of one of the most influential musicians of our time, Z Randall Stroope, the "Inscription of Hope" concert was born.

The overall project had two major components. The first was "Pennies for Peace." This program is designed to broaden children's cultural horizons, and to teach them about their capacities as philanthropistsone penny at a time. (In that poverty stricken area of the world a penny can buy a pencil.) Seven Harford County schools, two

itself served as collection sites, and \$4,000 was raised. That is 400,000 pennies!

In addition to that effort, a major concert event "Inscription of Hope" was organized fea-

turing five choirs with 213 vocalists, soloists Soprano Lauren Brown and Baritone Gregory Hoyt, concertmaster Igor Yuzefovich, and conducted by Randall Stroope, himself. The first half of the program featured seven of Stroope's own works focused on inspiring hope in a troubled world. The second half of the concert showcased John Rutter's Mass of the Children with an inspirational message from John Rutter supporting the effort. The concert generated \$26,000 to be donated to the cause.

In all, over 1,000 people were involved in the enormous fundraising efforts. And as a result of monies raised, a school in Paki-

churches, two local businesses, and the DCC stan was built, and operational expenses

Today the Pennies for Peace program is alive and well, still providing the opportunity for children to reach

out to help others. Over the past 20 years the Central Asia Institute has been able to support 450 projects and provide the gift of education to hundreds of thousands of people in Pakistan, Afghanistan, and Tajikistan.

According to the CAI statistics 98,225 people have benefitted, 67% of the beneficiaries were female, 1,183 teachers have been trained, 615 scholarships have been awarded, and there were 24 active construction projects in 2015. For more infor-
